

**DID YOU KNOW?** A bumblebee's wings beat about 130 times per second! They flap back and forth rather than up and down. This is how their tiny wings can support their body.

**DID YOU KNOW?** Bumblebees do not have ears. It is unknown whether or how well they can hear. However, they are sensitive to vibrations made by sound waves.

**DID YOU KNOW?** A group of bumblebees is called a <u>colony</u>. A dominant female called the Queen rules the colony while the other bees serve her.

## LOOK AND SEE!



This photo shows a bumblebee "<u>nectar</u> <u>robbing".</u> It is using its tongue to feed on the floral nectar.



Look how tiny the bumblebee's wings are compared to its body!

This photo shows a bumblebee nest. Notice that it is not organized into hexagonal combs like that of a honeybee. Instead, the wax pots of honey are clustered together randomly in the ground.
